There is a story about someone ringing neighborhood doorbells, leaving squash, and then running away. The Food Banks on Rt. nine at the Episcopal Church and in Barnegat, loved to see us come.

We gave two kinds of summer squash, many winter squash, cucumbers, string beans, two kinds of peppers, a few eggplant before the beetles got them, a few carrots and beets, and enumerable tomatoes!! Pretty good, but next year we could use more help. Alice Schovanec gave us tomato cages and the tomatoes still grew as tall as my head. Andrea Pharo planted pumpkins for the Fall, so we shall see if we get any of those. Millie Plant made squash

pickles that will be for sale at the UMW bazaar along with ten small loaves of zucchini bread by Lovisa Hill. People that picked and weeded while we were away, really kept the garden going. They were the Estelows, the Hanns, and James McShea. Art Hill was faithful taking the produce to the Food Banks two and three times a week. Lastly, I would like to thank the congregation for purchasing some of the produce and making donations. Your money will be used to start next year's garden.

Our students did amazing the first week, very few tears, and lots of smiles! Parents had a chance to meet and relax with our annual back to school coffee hour in fellowship hall.

Children in our beginners program started their year with a unit on families. Each student brought in photos of their families to place on the classroom family tree. Mrs. Dahlberg and Mrs. Russo used the photos to help the children adjust to their new class and work on language

skills by encouraging the children to talk about their families.

Mrs. Kolbmann and Mrs. Jones' classes started the year off with a unit on Teddy Bears. The children were so happy to share their first school experiences with a familiar friend from home.
