Lenten Challenge: 40-40-40

Many of us would try something different during 40 days of Lent, typically giving up one pleasure such as meat or chocolate. How about, this year, for a change, adding a new one, that is, spending time in prayer? This is an area most of us are not the best in, right?

Here's the idea. **40-40-40: 40 Days** in Lent (starting on March 5 counting all the days except Sundays through April 19 the day before Easter)—**40 Minutes** (using the Church directory, simply read aloud every name in prayer beginning with "A" and ending with "Z" praying for every family in it --301 families, to be exact)—**40 People** who would join me in this great spiritual endeavor.

Think of it this way: praying for others is a double blessing. The Lord uses your prayers to minister to the people on both ends: the one who is being prayed for and the other who prays (that is you). For instance, one day, I was praying for a member of our church and the Lord quietly prompted a strong urge in my mind to call her. So, when I did that afternoon, it was very timely. She was very pleased to hear from me and I freshly experienced the way God works—through prayers!

Ask yourself: How many people do I have in my life who would lift up my name and concerns to the Almighty God every day? Some of us are blessed to have multiple people who pray for us every day. Many others, however, don't have even one single soul who would do that (some of us don't even pray for ourselves!). I am very excited to launch this challenge knowing that **everyone** in our congregation will be remembered in daily prayers this Lent by **40** people for **40** minutes!

I strongly urge you to join me in this challenge **40-40-40!** Let's ring the ears of the Lord with our daily petitions for **40** days for **40** minutes coming from at least **40** prayer warriors for everyone in the Church directory!

Here's how to do it:

- 1. **Sign up:** on the sign-up sheet in the narthex of the church.
- 2. **Pick up:** the Daily Check List from the narthex to mark your progress.
- 3. **Lift up:** your church family in prayer starting March 5. Need a directory? Pick one p from the narthex.
