



PASTOR'S CORNER

Pray always and do not give up. -Jesus

Recently I read a heart-warming story on the power of intercessory prayer. Here is a copy of it below--a true story of a man whose first name is Aram. Read on.

"You must be hungry after shoveling so hard! Let me get you a piece of apple pie. Do you like apple pie? You stay right there and let me get you some pie."



She was an eighty-year-old widow, and I knew it would take at least ten minutes for her to make it into the kitchen, never mind dishing out the pie. I sat at the table, wondering how long she would make me sit before I got my pay and was out of there.

The offering was quintessential New England: light golden brown crust, piping hot apples, and cold milk in a tall glass. I devoured it.

She had barely sat down at the head of the table to enjoy her slice when she noticed my bare plate. "Let me get you another piece!" There was no declining the offer: she was into the kitchen before I could open my mouth. Funny how quickly she could move at times. The pie was good, the milk cold, and I made quick work of her second offering.

But she kept talking and talking. It was the unspoken dread of our neighborhood—getting caught with Mrs. Back. We all have a Mrs. Back in our lives. Even at that young age, I began to reflect, How could someone be so oblivious to the cues before her—how could she not notice that I wanted out of there?

About ten years later, on a Monday afternoon, something inside of me said, *You need to tell Mrs. Back.* For on that previous Friday night, at a bachelor party in Harvard Square, I gave myself to Jesus. I still hadn't told anybody. But somehow I knew: I was supposed to tell Mrs. Back.

It was a lovely spring afternoon in May, and Mrs. Back was hanging out her laundry to dry. I walked up to the fence, "Mrs. Back, do you know what it means to be "born again"?

She dropped everything and looked at me in sheer surprise and delight. "Why, yes I do." She had been a pastor's wife, after all.

"Well, the other night, I was born again."

She looked at me and said with a firm voice, "You stay right there!" I stood on the driveway, at the fence, watching her hobble up to the back door, up the steps

with her cane.

Ten minutes later she came out from the back door, walked over to me, and handed me the biggest, most delicious piece of chocolate cake I had ever eaten in my life. She smiled and said, "Eat it!" And I devoured that piece of chocolate cake as she stood there and gazed at me. Celebrating with me. Rejoicing for me.

Finally, she spoke. "For the last fifteen years, since you moved in, I have prayed every day for you and for Paul (my friend who lived on the other side of her house)—I prayed every day that you would come to know Jesus." (Philip Yancey, *Prayer*, pp. 310-311)

Pray every day for your loved ones that they would come to know Jesus. Keep on praying without giving up! Your prayers will be answered and they would eternally appreciate it.

ADDICTION (Thoughts to Live By)

Addiction defined means habitually given to a practice. Most people when thinking of addiction brings to mind drugs, alcohol, even sex. To many these are the evils of our society today; incurable. We become quick to judge or condemn, showing little compassion. In so doing we fail to look at ourselves in the mirror; in denial to our own addictions such as money, materialism, power and control, gossip, pride and unforgiveness. Yes I include the sins of pride and unforgiveness for they too are a form of addiction; a sickness just like a cancer. As we all know addictions (and sin) left ignored and unchallenged, without help, can and will destroy the individual, and also destroy relationships with family, friends and society. Even more important, destroy our relationship with God.

When talking to a friend about a recent problem that she had, it was troublesome to hear her say, "I know I should forgive, but; I can forgive almost anything but not this." It made me think how can anyone with an unforgiving heart go to church and take Communion or even say the Lord's Prayer? Try to justify their unforgiveness? If a Pastor knows someone has an unforgiving heart should they be denied communion? Are we denying the Cross; who Jesus was and why He came?

Jesus came to reconcile us to God the Father, but first we are to reconcile with each other. However a hardened heart fueled by pride and unforgiveness does not want healing.

The Parable of the Unmerciful Servant serves as an example of what will happen to someone with a unforgiving, hardened heart. As Jesus states in the parable, "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother from your heart." In other words, repent!

For the person who calls themselves Christian, forgiveness is not an option; it is mandated! It is part of the healing process.

As far as God is concerned each one of us has run up a monstrous debt of sin, yet God stands ready to forgive us for what we have done. Therefore who are we not to forgive others? **Do we think ourselves better than God?**

Keeping YOU in the loop: Family Promise

Our MUMC has made a promise to help the homeless from our own surrounding communities. Our church family members will be working with one another to provide the homeless with a safe place to sleep as well as food for breakfast, lunch and dinner. My grandmother always said, "Many hands make light work" and this should be our motto. Many church members have already indicated that they would help meet our goals as we open our doors in the spirit of compassionate hospitality for the homeless. We will be asked to host as many as 14 or as few as 2 homeless individuals during our Host Week. The task of hosting for seven nights requires more than one or two volunteers so now I ask you to look at the following list of Assistant Coordinator positions. I am serving as the church Volunteer Coordinator and will be the main contact person for our local Family Promise of Southern Ocean County, Inc. Director, Cheryl Polo.

Here are the volunteer positions:

Host Coordinator – Beth and Bob Schenck – scheduling evening and overnight volunteers – works closely with all other coordinators

Meal Coordinator – oversees meal planning – schedules volunteers for prep and serving

Supply Coordinator – food donations, paper products, clean up – linens

Activities Coordinator - activities or socialization

Donations Coordinator – collects items needed for hosting families

Our first hosting week will be the first week of August. Yes, August seems far away especially as I see piles of snow out my windows but it will be here in a heartbeat. In order for our church family to get the feel of the details for taking on our first "on our own" week we will be offering to assist other local churches for a day or two with their hosting week. We will start off slow by lending a hand with setup or tear down as well as making some meals. We will set up some opportunities to take a few "field trip" visits to learn how churches plan and set up for Family Promise individuals.

In order to begin our own commitments we have some needs that I know you can provide. We will need TWIN size sheets, pillowcases, and comforters/blankets. They do not need to be new, as you refresh your own linen closets,

please remember to donate your new or slightly used twin size linens. We will be providing our Family Promise guests with sleeping quarters and we will need twin size bedding.

Keep on the lookout for signup sheets for lending a hand to help us reach our hospitality goals for the homeless. Also keep in mind that we will be volunteering to assist other local churches meet their Family Promise commitments. Reaching out, lending a hand, and opening our hearts ... this is our commitment to the local Family Promise organization.

I tried calling each member of my prayer group but no one was home! All of a sudden an unbelievable peace came over me, I said to myself "What am I doing? I have the 91st Psalm"! I went to my bed and fell asleep. I woke up around 10:30PM and called her. No answer. So I sat in my rocking chair and said "Dear God, next time I call, could she be coming in the door?" Deep in my spirit I heard God say "She is Healed." I said praise you my Lord but you know me and I need to talk to her. At around 11:00PM I phone again and she said "Oh Mom, I'm just coming in the door!" When she got to the hospital the doctors could find no trace of her problem. She was healed and still is!!!

One more short miracle: We were flying to Chicago (I hate flying). When we got near the airport the pilot came on and said, we are going to have to circle around up here for a while as there is too much turbulence to land. I said "Oh dear God would you please help?" WOW, Immediately the pilot comes on and says "the atmosphere has changed and we will land as scheduled." As the saying goes "God Is Good All the Time, All the time God is Good" Amen (Anonymous)

Appeal for Funds to Support Clean Water Projects for Rural Areas in Central Ghana

The Mfantseman Association of N.J. is a mutual support group, made up of indigenous Fantis from the Central Region of Ghana. The Association however extends its membership to persons from any region of Ghana.

The primary mission of the Association is to make meaningful contributions to our local community in New Jersey. We seek to provide outreach support services for deprived people and communities that reside in Ghana.

Members of the Association deliberated on embarking on a project that will be beneficial to the welfare and well-being of the community and its people. In collaboration with the elders in some of the communities in the regions, the members agreed upon funding the constructions of well water systems in selected areas in the Central Region. The Central Region of Ghana is the third poorest region in Ghana in terms of access to basic human services and prevalence of diseases derived from the absence of a good water supply.

Our commitment to the project is bolstered by our knowledge that the prevalence of serious water borne diseases - like diarrhea and dysentery - in these communities could be reduced by the provision of clean water levels. The World Health Organization reports that over 3.6% of the global disease burden can be prevented simply by improving water supply, sanitation and hygiene. With the recent outbreak of Ebola, we all now know how small the world has become and disease can easily affect other people in other countries.

We have done the feasibility studies and concluded that we will need about \$20,000.00 for the constructions of the well water boreholes. All labor towards the construction will be provided by the local community. There will be no administrative costs or overhead paid out of the funds. All of the funds will be used for the project.

We are kindly asking you to donate generously toward this cause. We believe that it provides an excellent avenue to help our less fortunate families and friends else where in the world. You can give in honor of a loved one living or deceased loved one as well. Please make check payable to Mfantseman Association of NJ.

Please note the Association will have a Gala on September 19th 2015 to thank everyone who generously contributed to our fundraising. Thank you.
