PASTOR'S CORNER

I don't exactly remember how I started my prayer life. Neither can I recall who taught me to pray or when I first started to pray to the Heavenly Father. Like most of you, I never took a course on prayer such as "Prayer 101: Introduction to Prayer." However, I started praying sometime during high school. It was, of



course, after I became a believer in Jesus. As a believer, I naturally got into prayer (like a new born baby knows from the moment of birth how to breathe without training).

I remember some silly prayers to God that I would never repeat. For instance, I once asked (demanded—to be accurate) God to speak to me audibly so that I would believe in Him. Otherwise, I said, I quit. God never yielded to my silly ultimatum, though. Looking back, I am very glad that He didn't. From that experience, I learned that God is patient with my foolishness.

During my college days, I even tested the practicality of prayer. One year, I decided to experiment on prayer: whether it works or not to begin with; and if so, how exactly God answers prayers. So, I started a prayer journal where I would record all my prayer requests in detail. I did that for six months. At the end of the sixth month, I found 96 entries in the journal. To my great surprise, I found every one of them answered in one of the following ways: YES (majority). NO (some). WAIT (a few). I discovered that prayer is real, not just psychological hypnosis to comfort myself.

Then, there came the time when I did some serious prayers with fasting, especially during my major crises in life. Pouring my soul in anguish, I would cry out onto the Lord to deliver me from my troubles. The God Almighty surely listened and answered my humble pleas in the ways beyond imagination. Praise God!

Sometimes God reasons with me in prayers: I find Him very gentle and kind, patiently listening to my worries and frustrations. He reasons with me and leads me to His assurance that eventually takes away my worries.

After each prayer I always come out from God's Throne Room with the assurance that He is in control, faithful, and alive in my life. He is not the God who stays aloof from my daily challenges and struggles. Rather, He is deeply involved in the world affairs including mine. No wonder our God is Immanuel ('with-us-God').

This is why I designate this year to be the Year of Prayer so that all of us would engage in daily prayer and undeniably experience the Living God in our lives. Try it, and you will love it.

ANOTHER YEAR (Thoughts to live by) Kenneth Schorr

With the beginning of the New Year many people (myself included) wonder what the year will be like. Will the problems and challenges of last year still haunt us? Will new challenges test our faith? If we are not careful this "wondering" can lead to worry to the point where it begins to take over our lives, and can even begin to create health problems.

While I do not have all the answers there are some things we need to remember; such as:

- 1. Instead of worrying about what you can't do, think about what God can do for you.
- 2. The best way to stop worrying is to start praying.
- 3. Never confuse worrying about tomorrow with planning for tomorrow.
- 4. Prayer changes things; worry changes nothing.
- 5. Spend time in reading God's Word. Put yourself into what you are reading (Psalms as an example). Find those verses that you can call upon when you see yourself backsliding into old thoughts and habits. A few helpful Scripture verses are: Ps. 46:1,10; Provo 3:5-6; Isa. 43:1-2,19; Jer. 29:11; Eccl. 7:8-9; Mt. 11:29; Phil. 4:4-7,l3; IPe. 5:7. There are so many others. 6. Put aside all those things that prevent you from having a relationship with God and each other.
- 7. Surrender your will to God's will.

May we always remember, no matter how serious the problem, how desperate the situation,

God's love is greater and stronger. Put your trust in Him. Have a blessed New Year and may the grace and peace of God our Father and the Lord Jesus

Why not buy a card and give it away as a Random Act of Kindness?




SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS Submitted by: Rosemary Molinaro Sunday School Superintendent

Who can Donate Blood - It is important that you feel good when you donate blood. Healthy people who are at least 17 years old and weigh 110 pounds or more are usually eligible to donate blood. Federal regulations require that donors wait 56 days between regular whole blood donations.

Please remember to bring proper identification to the blood drive.

Consider being a Double Red Cell Donor If you are type O or B.

To be eligible you must be

Male - at least 130 pounds and 5'1" tall

Female - at least 150 pounds and 5'5"tall

Anyone interest in double red cell Call or see Marian Assur for an appointment

Also on the day of the drive there will be the need for support help. Registration, canteen, set up and clean up.
