

#### PASTOR'S CORNER 2017: The Year of Jubilee

Leviticus 25:10 New American Standard Bible (NASB)

"You shall thus **consecrate the fiftieth year** and proclaim a release through the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you, and each of you shall return to his



Church scholars, theologians, and pastors say that 2017 is the year of Jubilee. I join them in believing it important to observe this new year as the Year of Jubilee. Some of you wonder what Jubilee means and what's the significance of it. Let me explain to you as briefly as I can.

It originates from God's command in Leviticus 25:10 as you see above. Basically, the idea is that every 50 years, in Israel, all the land will be returned to original families, all debts are cancelled, and all the slaves are freed. The word 'Jubilee' comes from the Latin verb iūbilō, "shout for joy" (Wikipedia). Indeed, "it is a time of freedom and celebration because everyone receives back their original property and return home to their families" (Ibid.)

So, as pastor, I too declare that this new year will be our Jubilee in the following three areas: first, Jubilee in our spiritual well-being. We declare to every creature in heavens, on earth, and below the earth that we are free in Christ. No one owns us. We own no one either. As no one should serve two masters, we worship and serve ONLY ONE GOD—whose name is Jehovah the LORD. Next, we declare that we are going to be healthy this year. Yes, I am talking about physical well-being. We declare that it is God's will for us to be disease free and that God is our Healer. Finally, we declare that we will strive to be free of financial debt. A lot of believers in America live in debt. We will strive to be debt free as soon as possible. We will stay disciplined in our finances that we will not overspend and do everything in our power to pay off our current debt.

So, by the end of 2017, I pray that every one of us will say that this year has been indeed the Year of Jubilee.

#### **SHOPRITE GIFT CARD PROGRAM**

Shop-Rite card sales continue to drop. I hope things pick up again after the Holidays. Profit for November/December. was \$310.00. Last year, we had \$360.00 profit for the same period.

This is the program we have with Shop-Rite, where the Church buys gift cards at a 5% discount and then resells them to the congregation and friends for face value. The cards never expire and can be used at any Shop-Rite. They come in denominations of \$100.00, \$50.00 and \$25.00. Orders are taken on the first Sunday of each month and given to the purchasers on the second Sunday. We usually have extra cards if you forget to order on the first Sunday and would like to help with this easy way of adding to our Church income.

Keeping YOU in the loop: ... Our Family Promise (FP) hosting week is mid-August 13<sup>th</sup> through August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017. Our church has served as a SE Host Congregation for Family strengthening lives. Promise of Southern Ocean County for the past two years. Family

Promise of Southern Ocean County now has a new director. So we welcome Elizabeth Golla as our main contact for our Family Promise commitments. The past director Cheryl Polo has moved on to work for the Salvation Army. Our church will work closely with the new director, Elizabeth Golla, to prepare for our hosting week in mid-August 2017.

Our hosting weeks of the past have been a success. Some of you may be wondering how we manage to provide breakfast, lunch, and dinner in addition to providing temporary housing for up to 14 individuals for seven days within our church building. Well, it is through our congregation's dedicated efforts! We creatively turn our church preschool rooms into temporary hospitality rooms for FP families. Our congregation generously cooks dinners for each evening meal and donates all of the food for the week and the bedding that is needed for up to 14 individuals.

MUMC has been successful meeting our FP hospitality goals for the homeless during our once a year hosting commitment. However the burden to cover 52 weeks a year is real and many times it is a real struggle to cover each need for the population of homeless in our area. Other churches in the area open their church doors several times throughout the year. Their commitment is much larger than ours. We only provide hospitality (sleepover)

arrangements one time a year and that is when our preschool is closed for the summer. Other local churches open their doors to provide hospitality (sleeping) arrangements many times during the year but they need help providing all of the other aspects for a successful week. The Director of FP of SOC often sends an email requesting support from area churches. When we receive this email "all call for help" from Director Elizabeth Gallo we need to standup and help our fellow churches. The needy church's denomination is not important but Director E. Gallo's request for help is real and urgent. WE could and should offer a hand to help the other churches in our area as they sponsor sleepover arrangements for several different weeks throughout the year. Please consider contacting MUMC Family Promise coordinators Beth, Pauline, Angela or the church secretary if you could make a dinner for a homeless family. We would like to start a list of congregation members that may be able to provide an evening meal if needed. As previously noted other churches open their doors for several hosting weeks ... but it can become a struggle for that same congregation to provide all of the food for breakfast, lunch and dinner. If you could help and be on standby to be asked to make an evening dinner or donate food items please let one of our church FP coordinators know. Sometimes we know in advance which weeks that evening meals will be needed. It would be great if our church could have several congregation members on a "stand-by" list for evening meals and other food items if needed. Thank you for considering this request for help. Our MUMC is always reaching out, lending a hand and opening our hearts ... this is our commitment to the local Family Promise organization.

Who can Donate Blood – It is important that you feel good when you donate blood. Healthy people who are at least 17 years old and weigh 110 pounds or more are usually eligible to donate blood. Federal regulations require

that donors wait 56 days between regular whole blood donations.

Please remember to bring proper identification to the blood drive.

**Consider being a Power Red Donor** (formerly Double Red Cell Donor) if you are type O or B. To be eligible you must be:

Male – at least 130 pounds and 5'1" tall

Female – at least 150 pounds and 5'5" tall

Also on the day of the drive there will be the need for support help. Registration, canteen, set up and clean up.
