



FAIL

(Thoughts to live by)

In looking at the definition of "fail" in the dictionary, there were many ways to do so. Some were to become deficient, to become extinct, to be guilty of omissions or neglect, to forsake. Certainly, no one wants to fail, so when there is a danger of doing so, changes are required. That applies to the individual, the church, and even our nation and its leaders. Change can happen if we are willing to do so, if unwilling, then things will not get better, only worse.

In his book "Turning the Tide," Rev. Dr. Charles Stanley writes a chapter entitled, "Where We Have Failed," with regard to our nation. After reading the section on "Hallmarks of a Godly Nation," I had to agree with many of his thoughts and writings. From the White House and Congress, to the State House, to the corporate board room, to the church (sadly from some in the pulpit to some who sit in the pews), to the average man (or woman) on the street, we are drifting farther away from being a Godly nation. Often in the name of politics (or what is politically correct), there are those who refuse to take off their blinders, still trying to defend or justify un-Godly behavior! Unwilling to acknowledge we are being led out of the light, down dark paths we should not go, into the black hole of the abyss, by those who lack integrity, ethics, and morals, thinking themselves above the law; not wanting to be held responsible or accountable! Scripture such as the Book of Proverbs gives a clear warning as to who these people are and what will happen if we allow this to continue, as do other books. Read your Bible!

We cannot afford to fail! As Dr. Stanley writes, "More than ever in our history, it is time to speak up for what we know is right, good, and beneficial. There is nothing to be gained by silence --- and much to be lost." Don't you agree?
