



FAITH (Thoughts to live by) By Kenneth Schorr

Forsaking All I Trust Him! Scripture tells us to walk by faith, not by sight; but do we (you)?

Peter is a prime example of a person who claims to be a follower of Jesus so long as things go along smoothly in his life. However, when things begin to change in his life, then his faith falls apart. Read Matt. 14: 22 - 33; 26: 69 -75. Notice how his faith falters when things do not go as he expects. Sound familiar? Sadly, today, there are not only individuals, but also churches where you have to question, "Where is your faith; do you practice what you preach? Laodicea?

Faith is based on trust. Trust comes from hearing and reading God's Word and believing it to be true. Faith is all about a trusting relationship with God; it can grow or weaken. Sometimes we doubt, and strange as it may sound that's okay if it drives us into looking deeper in our relationship with God; to strengthen our trust and our understanding of faith. A word of caution! Unbelief or distrust can be destructive and should not be taken lightly!

God's will is that we trust Him. If we do He will deal with all our problems, but keep in mind, His will and time! Also, once we have faith, we need to share it with others; to be an example of a godly life which can be an effective way of bringing others to Christ. We can show how a godly person responds to the trials in life. As a Christian, individually and as a church, we are to show our faith in the love for others with both mercy and grace; not indifference; that is not of God! It is something we can do and should do, not just during the holidays, but every day!

Do you have the courage to test your own faith? For a start try reading the Epistle of James. Be honest and ask yourself, is that me? Am I the Christian I say I am? If your faith is weak, if you are afraid to get out of your boat and walk on water to Jesus, all is not lost. Pray, confess your weakness and ask the Holy Spirit into your life; to change your life. It's worth the walk!

Many babies die for lack of a warm cap or blanket. Many children have never had a new piece of clothing to call their own. To date we have sent over 200 sweaters to Knit for Kids. Please consider helping us to help them.

#### **FAMILY PROMISE**



As you know Family Promise of Southern Ocean County relies on the generosity of our local churches. They are grateful for our support. Our donations help families during a difficult time when they are struggling to provide for their basic needs. This past month we donated a Move-Out Kit to support a family who was moving out of Family Promise and into their own home. The  $\widehat{\text{mis}}$  Move-Out Kit was filled with all of the essential items that are needed when you move into a new Building communitie home. The Move-Out Kit started with a laundry basket and was filled with many cleaning supplies, shower curtain, bath mats, laundry detergent, bucket, mop and a broom etc.

During our Laity Sunday Mission Fair we collected money for the purchase of hairbrushes. We were able to donate 8 hairbrushes to our local Family Promise organization. You may not think about this simple everyday item but these essential personal care items are considered to be highly valuable to the homeless.

We are also starting up a new branch for our Family Promise mission. MUMC is going to be "on stand-by" or "on call" to provide meals for the homeless families being cared for by Family Promise. "Chefs on Call" is the name! We are a hosting site for Family Promise once a year but many other local churches open their doors many times throughout the year to serve as host sites. Sometimes those churches need help to provide evening meals for the families. We've decided to lend a hand to the other churches in our area by providing evening meals for the homeless. Please let Pauline, Beth or the church office know if you can volunteer to help with Chefs on Call. Please consider signing-up to cook a meal once in a while.

#### MISSION GARDEN

Recently when we were packing our car with food donated for the Food Banks, a man walking along Stafford Ave., asked if we were taking the food to the Food Bank. When we said "Yes," he thanked us and told about his daughter in Maine with three children. The husband had left and she was suffering from Fibromyalgia so her work was spotty. If it wasn't for the food bank, she didn't know what would have happened to them. The man telling us this was retired and I don't know if he was able to help.

So with a big thank you to all who supplement the food supplies each month, our church and the receivers send a big hug!! We did not have as successful a summer in the garden as we have in the past, except for cucumbers. The sun was often hidden behind clouds or it rained. The humidity was often high which leads to fungus growth and borer activity. We pulled the squash and some tomatoes early, but replanting did not help.

Even so, our crops though small, were welcome at the three Food Banks of: Barnegat, Ocean Community, and Saint Stephen's.

Our produce numbers were:

- 1. Green bell peppers 117
- 2. Banana peppers 261
- 3. Poblano peppers 24
- 4. Cucumbers 164
- 5. Zucchini 30
- 6. Yellow squash 9
- 7. Eggplant 33

- 8. Tomatoes 362
- 9. Lettuce 6 gallons
- 10. Spinach 3 gallons
- 11. Pea pods 5 quarts
- 12. Green beans 36 quarts
- 13. Potatoes 8 lbs.

Because of bad weather, we have not fully dismantled the garden. Before the snow flies, there should be a sunny Saturday. Let us know if you would like to help!!

We had the Uniontown Methodist Youth group come to help pick and dig vegetables again this year.

Just a reminder to put your Box Tops for Education in the basket on the left as you come in the main entry. Remember each Box Top is worth \$.10 which puts money towards school supplies. General Mills products sponsors this.
