

Pastor's Corner 2020: Walk with Jesus In the past six years, as pastor of MUMC, I have been designating each year with a certain focus. So far, we have focused on Gratitude, Knowing Jesus, Prayer, Jubilee, Bible, and Shalom. This year, 2020, I am designating to be the Year of Walk With

Loads of Love - 2019 Review

We had another very successful year with our Loads Of Love mission in 2019.

We serviced a total of 105 people. Our past few months were slow, probably because to our changing of the dates due to the holidays. We display our signs inside the Laundromat, as well as information in our local newspapers.

We spent a total of \$1302 and received in donations a total of \$1601.57-another year of receiving more donations than we are spending.

The donations received were from not only you our congregation, but from people in our community, from St Peter's of the Light Episcopal Church in Barnegat Light, the Heritage Point Women's Group, Mrs. Wilkerson, a New York resident who has a summer home on LBI. These outside contributions totaled \$1485.

As a result, we require no help from our church budget to sustain this mission.

We continue to urge our members to come out and see and help out. We operate from 6PM to 8PM the last Thursday of each month, unless otherwise noted. We have 2 shifts. First shift sets up at 5:30 and the second shift comes on board at 7PM and stays until 8PM or longer, depending on client needs.

We look forward to continuing this mission into 2020.

Thank you for your prayers, not only for us, but, importantly for the people who rely on this mission.

The Candy Cane Legend, read by St. Nick:

The Candy Cane Legend

The large red stripe represents the shedding of His blood on the cross for our salvation."




